Power of sympathetic reverberations created by double. Plus playing notes in unison, echoing. A story of a Certified Music Practitioner working in hospital emergency room and how the double strung harp calmed the patient's screaming.

Why after about a week, seeing the strings is easier than even a single. Mirroring chords while watching a patient or talking to a family member. 1-5-8's alternated with 1-6-8's. Three Against Four. Amazing Grace example - doubling the melody in the same register. Echoing it.

How to multiply the therapeutic effect of harp itself (which is already very therapeutic). Why a beginner will learn faster on double than single. Happy Accidents.

I think I got to this place by learning each skill separately and then without even realizing it, I am now constantly combining them (mirroring, echoing, ascending, descending, chicken talk etc) as I improvise.

"So for people who may feel intimidated by all this, combining these various tricks just comes naturally after you've practiced them separately for a while. And the beauty of this is that each trick can stand on it's own..so you can improvise one day simply by mirroring and it's lovely, then practice echoing another day, then another day, combine the two."
